HONORARY DEGREE

Dr Debra Roberts

Doctor of Science (*honoris causa*)

Dr Debra Roberts is head of the Sustainable and Resilient City Initiatives Unit in eThekweni Municipality and has been at the forefront of climate change action and research over the last twenty years in South Africa, Africa, and globally. Prior to taking up this post in 2016, she established and managed the Environmental Planning and Climate Protection Department of the same municipality for 22 years (1994-2016) and was selected as the city's first Chief Resilience Officer in 2013. She was the first South African scientist and a local government official to be elected as Co-Chair of Working Group II for the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) Sixth Assessment cycle in 2015.

Dr Roberts was awarded an Honorary Doctorate by the University of Twente (2022). In 2019 she was included in a political inaugural list of the World's 100 Most Influential People in Climate Policy, and in 2014 she received the African Climate Research Award both in 2014). She is an Honorary Professor at the University of KwaZulu-Natal in the School of Life Sciences and has been an advisor to the Global Commission on Adaptation, the United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), and the United Nations Secretary General's 2019 Climate Summit. She has written widely in the fields of urban open space planning, environmental management, and urban climate protection.

Despite working full time in policy and practice at eThekweni, Dr Roberts has produced exceptional scholarship on urban environmental governance and climate change action in cities. Her profile on Google Scholar, which includes citations for IPCC reports published since 2018 (not captured by Scopus) and citations in "Grey Literature" is equally strong (13 000 citations and an h-index of 41), indicating her substantial impact in thought leadership and practice, both in research and beyond the peer-reviewed journal world. Her research has shaped the global conversation on climate change and cities – both for research and practice – and her work over the last decades has been a major contributing factor in setting new priorities for urban research globally by powerfully increasing the focus on climate change, especially for cities in the Global South.

Her work has influenced many urban scholars who work on climate change, resilience, adaptation, and governance, in South Africa, Africa and globally, including those in the African Centre for Cities at UCT. Dr Roberts was a lead negotiator for the South African delegation involved in the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) negotiations until December 2015. She has also served on numerous international advisory bodies focused on climate change issues in cities (e.g., the Rockefeller Foundation's Asian Cities Climate Change Resilience Network; UN-Habitat's 2011 "Cities and Climate Change" Global Report). All her contributions above are aligned with UCT's Vision 2030 to bring strong African scholarship into global research and knowledge processes.

Allan Arthur Davids

Thesis Title: *Essays on the housing market*

Allan Davids holds a BA, BCom(Hons) and Master's degree *Cum Laude* in Economics, all from Stellenbosch University. He joined the School of Economics at UCT in 2016 for his PhD studies.

Allan Davids' thesis explores various features of the housing market in Cape Town. He shows that foreign buyers pay higher prices for property relative to local buyers because they are, on average, wealthier, and are less informed about the local property market. He also shows that these foreign buyers are more likely to purchase property following large exchange rate depreciations as the relative price of property falls in the foreign currency of the buyer. This increase in foreign demand leads to increases in housing prices but does not lead to crowding out of locals. Finally, he documents the extent of home foreclosures in Cape Town between 2011 and 2018 and finds that foreclosed homes, especially those that sell at auction, sell for large discounts because sellers of these properties are in financial distress and because the buyers of foreclosed properties are liable for a number of additional costs upon purchase.

Arther Kadakure

Thesis Title: *The influence of informal power structures on corporate strategy of a selected mining organisations in the Northern Cape province, South Africa*

Arthur Kadakure holds a BCom degree from UNISA and an MCom degree in Strategic Management from the Midlands State University, Zimbabwe. He joined the Graduate School of Business at UCT in 2016 for his PhD studies. Before joining UCT, he worked in the mining sector in Zimbabwe.

Arthur Kadakure's thesis focuses on the influence of informal structures within organisations, through a single case study he focused on the part played by the diverse socio-political context in South Africa. Using social theory, he investigates the influence of social ties and networks to create a deeper understanding of organisational behaviour. He further uses structuration theory to explore the dynamics of how individuals process and store information which they use to interpret and define meaning of corporate strategy. He then establishes that while social ties contain positive attributes, the negative attributes outweigh the good, leading to riotous behaviour and resistance to corporate strategy. He extends his focus to examine the effect of globalisation and historical narratives to define the response of employees to corporate strategy. He concludes by adapting a strategic management model that enables management of diversity and, which may lead to better acceptance of corporate strategy.

Ishara Maharaj

Thesis Title: *Building and breaking identities: how adversity shapes entrepreneurial motivation*

Ishara Maharaj holds a BSocSc with Honours degree in Linguistics and Psychology from Rhodes University. She then joined UCT for her MCom in Organisational Psychology. Before

joining the Graduate School of Business for her PhD in 2018, Ishara worked in human resources and with business accelerator programs in Cape Town.

Ishara Maharaj's thesis highlights the lived experiences of entrepreneurs based in Cape Town's informal settlements. She spent three years with a group of founders based in Imizamo Yethu and Philippi townships co-creating their life stories to understand how significant life events were experienced and how these events shaped their founding motives. She discovered that adverse life events threatened salient identities, influencing entrepreneurs' identity construction and behavioural responses in several ways. Multiple forms of adversity motivated how they established new ventures, either for their communities or with a redemptive or emancipatory motive. Her research extends work on entrepreneurial adversity, identity and motivation in a developing context. She demonstrates that despite various adverse life events, informal entrepreneurs are motivated beyond necessity-driven factors. Her work highlights the prominence and interconnectedness of pre-venturing identities to adversity in shaping founder identity and entrepreneurial motivation.

Mziwoxolo Mayedwa

Thesis Title: *Towards the implementation of a fully-fledged electronic services for citizens: The case for local government in South Africa*

Mziwoxolo Mayedwa holds a Bachelor's degree in Commerce and Master's degree in Public Administration from the University of the Western Cape, South Africa. Before joining UCT to do his PhD studies, Mziwoxolo worked in the Higher Education sector and in the drowning prevention programmes in South Africa. He is the founder and non-executive director of Digital Transformation

Africa a nonprofit company that empowers young IT entrepreneurs in SA.

Mziwoxolo Mayedwa's thesis focuses on the infusion of ICTs in local government of South Africa. He uses multi-modal methods to investigate factors that influence the implementation process of e- services. The study first surveyed 205 existing local government e-government platforms to understand the state of e-government in local government and also conducts a survey on 579 citizens to investigate their perspectives on e-government portals. Furthermore, the study conducts a purposive sample of 35 in-depth interviews to understand the e-government actor's perspective on factors that hinder the implementation of e-government-for-citizens. Lastly, he uses agency theory to develop a framework that addresses the implementation challenges experienced by local government in South Africa.

Shameema Ebrahim Raja
Thesis Title: *Customer experience as an antecedent to market orientation: a mixed methods study of postgraduate students*

Shameema Raja completed her BSocSc, Postgraduate Diploma in Management, and her MBA at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. She later enrolled at the UCT Graduate School of Business to complete her doctoral studies.

Shameema Raja's thesis investigates the extent to which customer experience influences market orientation initiatives in a higher education setting. A conceptual model of Market Orientation and Customer Experience is proposed, with the nexus of this relationship being the concept of Co-creation of the service experience. A mixed methods approach is adopted, based on data collected from master's students and supervisors to analyse the dissertation experience. The major contribution of this study is a cyclical model rather than a sequential model, where a positive relationship between Customer Experience and Market Orientation is possible, conditional on the institution's ability to

promote co-creation initiatives amongst its key stakeholders. The findings show that the higher the level of Individual Market Orientation practiced by supervisors, the more likely the student experience is to be positive, with higher levels of customer satisfaction among students.

Candice Bronwynn Helen Watson
Thesis Title: *Understanding the underrepresentation of women in senior management in Africa in the context of perpetual practices of exclusion*

Candice Watson completed her BA(Hons) qualification at the University of Johannesburg in 2004 and completed her MBA at the University of Pretoria's Gordon Institute of Business Science in 2010. She is a seasoned executive, having held various HR roles over the last 17 years in listed and multinational companies.

Candice Watson's thesis reports on the historical and perpetual practices of exclusion that women in Africa experience in progressing their careers through the management ranks. Research respondents in the study were from Africa and/or had worked in Africa. The thesis reports on the systemic nature of exclusion, as well as the costs and sacrifices women endure in their management experiences. Findings from the study are useful for understanding exclusionary and discriminatory societal and organisational practices and provide bases from which to construct practical interventions.

Kevin Nicholas Barends
Thesis Title: *Measurement of the top
quark mass from top quarks produced in
proton-proton collisions at $\sqrt{s} = 13$ TeV
that decay to dimuons via a J/ψ*

Kevin Barends completed his BSc,
BSc(Hons) and MSc qualifications
at UCT, and began full-time
study towards a PhD in 2019.

Kevin Barends sorted through
billions of proton-proton collisions at the
highest energies ever created by humanity
at CERN's Large Hadron Collider to
further our understanding of the natural
interactions that take place between
the building blocks of the universe. He
made use of ATLAS a 30m long 5m high
digital camera which records thousands
of proton-proton collisions every second,
and was personally responsible for
detector performance, and for building
and validating the model to measure
the mass of the heaviest building block
(The Top Quark) via a pioneering
method. In combination with further
high-precision measurements, this result
will inform humanity's understanding
of fundamental unknowns, like Dark
Matter, Dark Energy, and the origins and
evolution of the universe.

Wade Matthew De Kock
Thesis Title: *An analysis of anomalously
wet summers in the South Western Cape
of South Africa*

Wade De Kock completed
his BSc, BSc(Hons) and MSc
degrees at UCT, and began full-
timestudy towards his PhD in 2019.

Wade De Kock's thesis
highlights the importance of anomalously
wet summers in the South Western Cape,
South Africa, to regional water supply,
particularly if the winter rains have
failed. Due to highly variable rainfall
in the region and following the multi-
year "Day-Zero drought", it is necessary
to identify rainfall patterns throughout
the year. Although understudied, the
extended summer accounts for a third of
the region's rainfall and these rains occur
during the most crucial time when there
is a high agricultural demand and dam
levels decrease. He identifies that most
large rainfall events result from cut-off
lows and atmospheric rivers, and these are
found to have occurred less frequently in
recent years. The last two decades have
experienced fewer cases of anomalously
wet summers than earlier decades and
this suggests drought vulnerability. His
findings highlight the importance of wet
summers especially when following drier
than normal winters.

John Mbaluka Kimeu
Thesis Title: *Unravelling
multidimensions of the flora of Kenya
– floristics, herbivory defenses and
phylogenetic diversity*

John Kimeu holds a Bachelor of
Environmental Science degree
and an MSc in Plant Ecology, both
from Kenyatta University, Kenya.
Before joining UCT, he worked at
the National Museums of Kenya
based at the East African Herbarium.

John Kimeu's thesis explores
different dimensions of the vegetation
of Kenya, towards understanding its
ecology and evolution. At the broad

scale he investigates whether current classification approaches effectively separate the vegetation into distinct units, and further determines climatic factors driving the vegetation assembly. He finds that forests are not a single unit, as high elevation forest are associated with higher rainfall and cooler climate whereas coastal forests are in wet warmer areas, and savannas occupy the intermediate areas. Using DNA sequence data, he then infers age and phylogenetic diversity of the three main vegetation units, finding the coastal forest to contain lineages predating the genesis of the Kenyan highlands, with the savannas youngest and phylogenetically least diverse. Narrowing in on the mesic savanna, he evaluates the occurrence of two distinct vegetation assemblages finding them to occupy distinct soil types, and that these vegetation assemblages use a combination of structural and chemical defenses against herbivores.

Constance Mawunyo Korkor
Thesis Title: *Mechanism of action studies of phenotypic whole-cell active antimalarial leads through target identification*

Constance Korkor holds a BSc degree in Chemistry from the University of Ghana. She joined the Department of Chemistry at UCT in 2018 for her MSc, and later upgraded to a PhD.

Constance Korkor's thesis focuses on understanding the mechanism of action of antimalarial leads found to selectively kill the causative agent of human malaria; the parasite specifies *Plasmodium falciparum*. She employs various techniques, including exploiting the intrinsic fluorescence properties of some of the lead compounds to study their subcellular accumulation in *Plasmodium falciparum*. She identifies the protein binding partners of these compounds from parasite cell lysate using chemoproteomics techniques. This allows her to identify proteins of importance to the parasite,

which, when inhibited, would lead to parasite death. Finally, she employs genomics techniques, specifically in vitro resistance selection, to study the resistance mechanisms of parasites to these compounds. Her findings contribute knowledge to antimalarial drug discovery efforts.

Anele Mavi
Thesis Title: *Modelling and computational analysis of heat-transfer in multi-geometry and multi-phase flow of Newtonian and non-Newtonian fluids in pipes and channels*

Anele Mavi holds BSc and BScHons degrees in Computational and Applied Mathematics, both from the University of the Witwatersrand. She joined UCT in 2017 for her MSc studies in Applied Mathematics and commenced her PhD studies in 2019. Before coming to UCT she worked in the banking sector.

Anele Mavi's thesis develops mathematical models to investigate heat-exchange characteristic in heat-exchangers and in multi-phase flow. Newtonian fluids, Newtonian-Fluid-Based-Nanofluids, and non-Newtonian fluids are all considered. Focus is specifically on double-pipe counterflow heat-exchangers, on solid-liquid-gas multi-phase boiling flow and bubble formation problems in channels. Numerical solution algorithms based on the Finite Volume Methods are implemented on the OpenFOAM software. Volume-of-fluid methods are employed for liquid-gas interface tracking and volume-fraction methods account for the concentration of nano-particles in the liquid-phase. Water is used as the base-liquid and the solid-phase is modelled via both aluminium oxide and titanium oxide nano-particles. The gas phase is considered as a vapour arising from the boiling processes of the liquid-phase. The simulations and results accurately capture both the formation of vapour bubbles in the liquid-gas flow and the simulated boiling processes.

The presence of the nano-particles is demonstrated to enhance the heat-transfer, boiling, and bubble formation processes.

Kyle-Mark Middleton
Thesis Title: *Individual contributions to group behaviour in the cooperatively breeding southern ground-hornbill *Bucorvus leadbeateri**

Kyle-Mark Middleton completed his BSc and BSc(Hons) qualifications at the University of Pretoria. He joined UCT as a field assistant to manage the FitzPatrick Institute of African Ornithology's APNR Ground-Hornbill Project in 2016. Soon after joining, he decided to pursue his MSc, and subsequently upgraded to his PhD.

Kyle-Mark Middleton's thesis focuses on the evolution of cooperative breeding where individuals live in groups and forego their own breeding to contribute towards raising offspring that are not their own, among other group tasks. Specifically, he investigates how individuals within cooperatively breeding southern ground-hornbill groups contribute towards the group behaviours of reproduction and territory defence, and the benefits that they provide to individuals which could promote this social system. Using a combination of long-term and experimental data, he finds that individuals of different ages contribute different amounts and that individuals receive simultaneous breeding and territory defence benefits from living in groups. These findings contribute to the understanding of why individuals form groups and help others breed rather than attempting to breed themselves.

Nolusindiso Ndara

Thesis Title: *Environmental change and soil organic carbon storage in a dust emission hotspot, Free State, South Africa*

Nolusindiso Ndara completed her BSc, BSc(Hons) and MSc qualifications at the University of the Western Cape, and began full-time study towards her PhD in 2018.

Nolusindiso Ndara's thesis focuses on shifting land use, climate change, and soil organic carbon storage in the Free State. The aim was to establish appropriate land management strategies for storing optimum soil organic carbon and to reduce associated land degradation. Using the DAYCENT carbon model to simulate soil carbon, she found that grassland cover, with moderate herbivory, is the most suitable land management strategy to enhance carbon storage into the future. These results will serve as a guide to government and relevant stakeholders when making decisions about future land management strategies.

Isabelle Sindizwa Nunes Da Costa

Thesis Title: *Turbulence in the sea ice impacted Southern Ocean and its implications for primary production and carbon export*

Isabelle Nunes Da Costa (née Giddy) completed her BSc, BSc(Hons) and MSc degrees at UCT. Before beginning her PhD in 2018, she worked in development and conservation and education in Southern Africa, completing her PGCE through UNISA. Her PhD degree is jointly registered at UCT and the University of Gothenburg.

Isabelle Nunes Da Costa's thesis presents the first high-resolution glider observations in the seasonally sea ice covered Southern Ocean. This region is globally important for the distribution of heat, freshwater, carbon and nutrients. Here turbulent processes in the upper ocean mediate the exchange and

mixing of water properties between the upwelling warm, carbon-rich deep water and the sea ice influenced surface layer, setting the properties of the water that enters the global overturning circulation. Sea ice melt was observed to enhance the formation of kilometer scale eddies. Further, turbulent mixing in the surface and subsurface drives the seasonal warming of winter water. Finally, algal growth is sensitive to mixing processes during winter, such as the growth of sea ice, and this results in increased carbon export to the mesopelagic. Together, these processes are important for setting the properties of subducted waters that impact the global oceans and our climate.

Lucy Kay Smyth

Thesis Title: *Investigating the conservation value of leopard population indices obtained through camera traps in the greater Kruger region of South Africa*

Lucy Smyth completed her BSc and BSc(Hons) degrees at UCT. She started studying towards her MSc through the Institute for Communities and Wildlife in Africa and in collaboration with Panthera in 2018, and upgraded to a PhD in 2019.

Lucy Smyth's thesis focuses on the use of camera traps as a tool for monitoring leopard populations, and provides an assessment on the status of leopard populations in and around Kruger National Park in South Africa. She investigates how leopard density varies in and around the southern and central areas of the park, and finds that differences in density are driven by an interaction between reserve management and ecosystem productivity. She also explores differences in activity patterns between sites, and how these provide an indication of the environmental and anthropogenic pressures to which leopard populations are exposed. Furthermore, she considers the relationship between

phenotypic resemblance and genetic similarity, finding that while leopard pelage patterns are heritable, they do not provide us with a reliable indication of relatedness. Her findings provide a crucial baseline of leopard population status in the region, while also contributing towards global leopard monitoring efforts.

Anna Catherine Steynor

Thesis Title: *Exploring the role of climate change risk perceptions in informing climate services for adaptation in East Africa*

Anna Steynor completed her BSc(Hons) and MSc at UCT. Following a period of working in climate adaptation, she joined UCT in 2011 as the Head of Climate Services within the Climate System Analysis Group (CSAG). In 2018, she embarked on a PhD alongside her role within the CSAG research centre.

Anna Steynor's thesis focuses on the role of climate change risk perceptions in informing the design and development of climate services for adaptation to climate change. To this end, she quantifies and explores the climate change risk perceptions amongst policy decision influencers in east Africa, and the factors determining risk perceptions. Building on this analysis, a model is developed to explain how the various determinants of risk perceptions interact and so contribute to influencing climate change risk perceptions and consequent decisions for climate change adaptation. Anna Steynor uses this model as a tool to better understand how to prioritise and align climate services to the context of the individual decision maker, by taking their risk perceptions into account. She also identifies gaps in currently available climate services in relation to specific user needs, thereby helping to inform more effective climate services.

Thesis Title: *Characteristics of precipitation and extreme precipitation events over the Drakensberg Mountains in past and future climates*

Roland completed his BSc and MSc in Physics at the University of Yaoundé 1 (Cameroon). He obtained additional MSc degrees in Mathematical Science at the African Institute of Mathematics (South Africa) and in Information Technology at the University of Madras (India). He began full-time study towards his PhD in 2015.

Roland Takong's thesis studies the characteristics of precipitation and extreme precipitation events over the Drakensberg, examines the major regional atmospheric features that induce widespread extreme precipitation events over the mountain, and projects the potential impacts of climate change on the precipitation over the mountain at different various global warming levels. Different types of datasets (including observation and climate model simulations) were analysed for the study. The thesis results reveal that weak synoptic days may account for up to 20% of daily weather condition and 5% of annual rainfall over the Drakensberg and may induce widespread extreme rainfall (up to 20 mm day⁻¹) over the mountain. The thesis also reveals that, among the four major patterns of widespread extreme rainfall over the Drakensberg, the most prevalent pattern features the heaviest precipitation on the eastern side of the mountain. The pattern is usually induced by tropical temperate troughs, cold fronts, and the ridging highs. The thesis projects a future increase in annual precipitation, frequency and intensity of extreme precipitation, and widespread extreme rainfall events, but a decrease in the number of precipitation days and number of continuous wet days over the Drakensberg.

HISTORICAL SKETCH

Founded as the South African College (a boys' school that aimed to provide higher education as well) in 1829, the University was established as the University of Cape Town in 1918.

The early history was one of great expectations and hard times and it was not until the early years of the twentieth century that the University was developed into a fully-fledged tertiary institution. A significant and pioneering development in the 19th century was the admission of women as degree students in 1886, many years ahead of most universities in the world.

At the start of the 20th century the University incorporated the Diocesan College, the teacher training classes of the Normal College, the South African College of Music and the Cape Town Schools of Fine Art and Architecture.

The Medical School was established and in the 1920s the University began a partnership with the local health authority (now the Provincial Government's health department) that saw the Medical School move from the Hiddingh Campus and the Green Point Somerset Hospital to Observatory (the rest of UCT's Upper Campus moved from Hiddingh to its present site, on part of Cecil Rhodes' estate, in 1928). This partnership allowed for the construction of the first Groote Schuur Hospital on a University site. The partnership continues to this day and now involves not only Groote Schuur as a teaching hospital but Red Cross Children's Hospital, Valkenberg and a growing number of primary health care sites.

The period between the end of World War II and 1994 was marked by two themes. Firstly, the University recognised that if it was to be fully South African, it would have to move beyond academic non-segregation to be fully inclusive. It would have to face the consequential and increasing clashes with a government determined to legislate for segregation and enforce the doctrine of apartheid. And secondly, the University intended to transform into a leading research institution.

Before World War II, the University was largely a teaching university and its students were mostly undergraduates. The research undertaken was sporadic, though in some cases notable. A research committee was appointed for the first time in 1945. The next 75 years saw a great expansion of research and scholarly work such that the UCT of 2014 has a greater proportion of highly rated researchers and gains significantly more research grants and awards than any other South African University.

The 1980s and 1990s were characterized by the deliberate and planned transformation of the student body. This was aided by the establishment of the Academic Development Programme aimed at helping students from disadvantaged educational and social backgrounds to succeed and the desegregation of student residences. As a result, a student body that was 90% white in 1979, when UCT marked its 150th anniversary, is in 2014 more than 50% black. The total student enrolment of just above 26 000, includes international students drawn from over 100 countries, a significant proportion of which are from SADC states. Particular emphasis is placed on postgraduate studies and more than 20% of these students will be enrolled in master's and doctoral programmes. A growing number of postdoctoral fellows contribute substantially to the research endeavours and reputation of the University (UCT has more than a third of the total number of post docs in South Africa).

UCT continues to work towards its goal to be Africa's leading research university. Its success can be measured by the scope of study it offers and the calibre of its graduates.

OFFICERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

CHANCELLOR

The Chancellor wears a gown made from dark blue silk. The front of the gown has facings down each side made of dark blue velvet embroidered with a gold floral design. The gown and sleeves are lined with pale blue silk and the sleeves are looped up in front with a gold cord and button. The yoke of the gown is edged with gold cord. The gown is worn with a square blue velvet hat with a soft crown and gold tassel.

VICE-CHANCELLOR

The Vice-Chancellor wears a gown made from bright blue silk. The front of the gown has facings down each side and sleeve-linings of pale blue silk. The sleeves are looped up in front with a gold cord and button and the yoke of the gown is edged with gold cord. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a silver cord.

DEPUTY VICE-CHANCELLOR

A Deputy Vice-Chancellor wears a gown made from dark blue silk. The gown has closed sleeves with an inverted T-shaped opening at the level of the elbow to free the arms. The front of the gown has facings of light blue down each side. The sleeves are lined with light blue and the yoke of the gown is edged with silver cord. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a silver cord.

CHAIR OF COUNCIL

The Chair of Council wears a gown, of the same pattern as that worn by the Vice-Chancellor, made from light blue silk. The front of the gown has facings down each side and a yoke of dark blue. The sleeves are lined with dark blue and the facings and yoke are trimmed with gold cord. The sleeves are looped up in front with a gold cord and button. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a gold tassel.

MEMBERS OF COUNCIL

Members of Council wear graduate-pattern gowns made from black silk. The front of the gown has 10cm wide, light blue facings down each side trimmed with dark blue cord. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a blue cord.

REGISTRAR

The Registrar wears a gown made from black silk. The front of the gown has 10cm wide facings of blue silk down each side. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a white cord.

PRESIDENT OF CONVOCATION

The President of Convocation wears a gown made from black silk and has long closed sleeves with an inverted T-shaped opening at the level of the elbow to free the arms. The front of the gown has facings down each side and sleeves of blue silk. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a blue tassel.

ACADEMIC DRESS (continued)

GOWNS

A plain black gown styled after the pattern of the Oxford scholar's gown is worn by diplomats, and Bachelor's, Honours and Master's graduands. Senior doctoral graduands wear a scarlet gown, with facings the colour distinctive of the faculty in which the degree is awarded. PhD graduands wear a scarlet gown without facings.

HOODS

The hood is particular to the qualification and the faculty. Diplomates and Bachelor's graduands wear a black hood lined with white and edged with the colour distinctive of the faculty. Master's graduands wear a black hood lined with the colour distinctive of the faculty and edged with white, except in the case of the hood for the MMed degree, which is edged with red. Senior doctoral graduands wear a hood of the colour distinctive of the faculty and a black velvet bonnet with a cord of the colour distinctive of the faculty in which the degrees is awarded. PhD graduands wear a hood of scarlet lined with black and a black velvet bonnet with a cord of the colour distinctive of the faculty in which the degree is awarded.
