HONORARY DEGREE

Her Excellency †Xuu Katrina Esau

Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*)

Her Excellency Esau is highly commended for her contribution towards Language Studies and her mission to preserve the endangered culture of the San people. She has chosen to face up to the mammoth task of teaching a largely oral language and the unique traditions of the San people. She has remained attached to the culture but moving with modern times of technology to preserve her near extinct indigenous language of N|uu.

Her plans are to create educational CDs and DVDs so that anyone anywhere can learn the N|uu language. Her seminal book !Qhoi n|a Tijhoi (Tortoise and Ostrich) is the only children's book published in N|uu which has been translated into English and Afrikaans making it widely accessible. She teaches at a small school located at the front of her house in Rosedale, outside Upington in the Northern Cape. She started teaching the San language after it was thought to have died out.

Her Excellency's work is known nationally and internationally, she has inspired the work of linguists, scholars, archivists, and language activists across the globe. She has highlighted the role of language preservation as a scholarly, curatorial, and human rights discipline. She has also contributed to the linguistic granary through publication, proliferation, direct engagement as forms of knowledge production that include not only linguistic heritage but the values, sounds, feelings, and tangible and intangible memories that it carries.

Her Excellency Esau's passion for identity and preservation of the ancient language is indefatigable. In 2014 she received the Silver Order of the Baobab by the President of South Africa. She is a role model and inspiration for young generations of speaker of N|uu and all endangered languages. On any given day, her house is abuzz with activity as she teaches and transfers valuable knowledge to the youth with the hope that the San people's language and cultural ways would prevail. An honorary doctorate highlights the importance of the linguistic diversity of the country, continent, and the globe.

Athinangamso Esther Nkopo
Thesis Title: *Blackness as a question of freedom: racial Blackness in South African emancipatory thought*

Athinangamso Nkopo holds an honours degree in International Relations from the University of the Witwatersrand and a Master's in African Studies from the University of Oxford.

Athinangamso Nkopo's thesis uses the theoretical framework of Afropessimism in order to explore and expose the limits of several major South African forms of political and philosophical thought, and campaigns for Black emancipation: South African Western Marxism, Black Consciousness and intersectional Feminism. In doing so, the thesis highlights how the existing historiography of South Africa has disarticulated the conceptual significance of racial slavery to the making of Blackness. Mobilising the argument of Afropessimism that Blackness is an ethico-political structure, in which the slave's natal alienation and social death establishes enduring forms of Black (non)being, Athinangamso Nkopo's thesis offers a critique of a civil politics of Blackness in both national liberation and 'progressive' struggles.

Beauty Friday Happy Umana
Thesis Title: *Immigrant language vitality: exploring the language practices of Nigerian immigrants in Cape Town*

Beauty Umana holds BA (summa cum laude) and BA(Hons) (cum laude) degrees from the University of the Western Cape, an MA from UCT and an MA in Health from York University, Canada. She has a tutored and lectured at various levels.

Beauty Umana's thesis examines the language practices of Nigerian immigrants in Cape Town, and how they affect those immigrants' heritage-language use. Drawing on the conceptual framework of language maintenance, here in context of West Africans' migration to post-apartheid South Africa, her thesis illuminates the consequences of South African anti-immigrant sentiments on immigrants' lives, and on their language learning. She presents data from participant observation amongst parents and children, and from interviews, to highlight how Nigerian immigrants' language practices are influenced by socioeconomic and socio-cultural factors. These include immigrants' economic viability, their need to assimilate into a new society, and their allegiance to a heritage identity. Her work reveals that fear of discrimination undermines heritage-language use whilst desire to maintain Nigerian identity promotes it. Demonstrating that language attitudes are complex and determined by context, and that language attitudes do not always match behaviour, Beauty Umana's thesis offers new insights for understanding the relationship of language attitudes to behaviour.

Christella Sinthuja Alphonsus
 Thesis Title: *Preoperative testing and medical therapy intervention to improve perioperative outcomes in noncardiac surgical patients*

Christella Alphonsus completed her MBChB at the University of Transkei in 2001, trained in anaesthesia at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, completing her FCA(SA) in 2012, and Master's in Medicine in 2014. In 2019, she was appointed as a specialist at Groote Schuur Hospital where she leads perioperative cardiovascular research.

Christella Alphonsus' thesis examines cardiovascular risk stratification and modification in surgical patients focusing on the role of B-type natriuretic peptides (BNP). Systematic

reviews of clinical trials for optimising cardiovascular function demonstrated potential utility for exercise therapy, but not for medical therapy optimisation guided by BNP testing. However, aggressive medical therapy did support a potential mortality benefit in non-surgical patients. This suggests that further work is needed to understand the relationship between aggressive medical optimisation prior to surgery, the role of BNP risk stratification and patient mortality. Further prospective observational work confirmed the silent, significant burden of cardiovascular risk in elective surgical patients in the Western Cape. This was supported by an African continental surgical study confirming an incidence of cardiovascular complications similar to reports from high-income countries. The urgency of these findings led to the development of the first context-specific cardiovascular risk stratification guidelines for non-cardiac surgery in South Africa.

Zinhle Cindi's thesis investigates how genetic differences influence blood concentrations of modern antiretroviral drugs, dolutegravir and tenofovir, and how they affect weight gain associated with these drugs among Southern Africans adults living with HIV. Her findings have improved the understanding of genetic determinants of dolutegravir plasma exposure in an African population, which included identifying a novel association with a variant in *UGT1A1*, a gene which encodes the drug metabolising enzyme for dolutegravir. She also observed novel

associations with tenofovir exposure and weight gain, which require validation in other studies or populations. To date, these are the largest studies that have investigated associations between genetic variants and drug exposure of modern antiretrovirals in an African population. As dolutegravir and tenofovir form part of the preferred first- or second-line regimens for treating HIV, these data aid in the understanding of pharmacogenetics of dolutegravir and tenofovir among people of African descent.

Ashar Vijay Dhana

Thesis Title: The evaluation of different strategies to improve the diagnosis of tuberculosis in people living with HIV in resource-limited settings

Ashar Vijay Dhana holds an MBChB from the University of Witwatersrand. He then completed his MPH from Harvard University and his MMed at the University of Cape Town. He began his research for his PhD in 2019.

Ashar Dhana's thesis investigates the diagnostic accuracy of screening tools and strategies for tuberculosis in people living with HIV. He obtained data from 29 separate studies of over 20,000 participants and analyzed the data using meta-analytic techniques. Among ambulatory participants, he demonstrates that the current World Health Organization (WHO) screen based on symptoms has suboptimal accuracy to guide further confirmatory testing for tuberculosis. C-reactive protein, which is a marker of inflammation, approached the WHO target for an ideal screening test but would miss a small proportion of tuberculosis cases. If resources permit, confirmatory testing for tuberculosis may be considered in all ambulatory participants. Among hospitalized

participants, WHO symptom screening and other potential screening tools have suboptimal accuracy, meaning that confirmatory testing for tuberculosis should be done in all HIV-positive inpatients. These findings have policy implications for global tuberculosis programs and informed the updated 2021 WHO guidelines on tuberculosis screening in people living with HIV.

Ryan Michael Dinkele

Thesis Title: Catching a glimpse: the visualization of Mycobacterium tuberculosis from TB patient bioaerosols

Ryan Dinkele completed a BSc in Biochemistry and Microbiology and a BMedSci (Hons) in Infectious Diseases and Immunology in 2014 and 2015, respectively. He began fulltime study towards his PhD in 2016 and, in 2018, co-registered for a master's in public health degree in Biostatistics and Epidemiology which he will obtain in 2023.

Ryan Dinkele's thesis reports the development of an innovative fluorescence microscopy-based technique for the detection and visual characterisation of live *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* bacilli produced by tuberculosis (TB) patients in bioaerosol droplets. Based on differential fluorescence probe uptake, this work suggests heterogeneity in both the metabolic state of aerosolised bacteria and their mode of release, with some organisms detected in clumps. He then applied this technique to investigate how and when *M. tuberculosis* bacilli are aerosolised, comparing normal breathing, deep breathing, and coughing. Contrary to long-held assumptions, his results established that *M. tuberculosis* bacilli are aerosolised through normal breathing – without requirement for cough. Moreover, given the large number of normal breaths every individual takes in a day, breathing alone is estimated to

contribute more than 90% of the daily *M. tuberculosis* bioaerosol output among patients with active TB disease.

Anna Jane Dreyer

Thesis Title: An exploration of sociodemographic and psychosocial determinants of cognitive performance in a peri-urban clinic population of people with HIV in Cape Town, South Africa

Anna Dreyer completed her BSc, BSocSc (Hons), and MA in neuropsychology at UCT. After completing her neuropsychology internship, she began her doctoral research in the HIV Mental Health Research Unit in 2018. She is a registered neuropsychologist interested in accurate and fair diagnosis of cognitive impairment in diverse, socioeconomically disadvantaged settings.

Anna Dreyer's thesis investigates cognitive impairment in people with HIV (PWH), which numerous studies report to be highly prevalent. Accurate definitions of HIV-associated cognitive impairment require consideration of how impairment is defined using a neuropsychological assessment and the contribution of non-HIV factors to cognitive test performance. Anna Dreyer's thesis investigates the influence of these variables on cognitive performance and the relationship of cognitive performance to treatment adherence. Findings suggested that non-biological, mainly psychosocial and

socioeconomic factors, were stronger predictors of cognitive test performance than medical factors (including HIV-disease variables) and rigid quantitative neuropsychological approaches of defining impairment do not accurately define HIV-associated cognitive impairment. The findings also identify poor global cognitive performance as a potential barrier to achieving HIV suppression. The implication of these findings is that research studies may be overestimating the prevalence of HIV-associated cognitive impairment and a diagnosis should not be based purely on cognitive test scores.

Nazanin Ghafari
Thesis Title: *Genetic and pharmacokinetics factors associated with susceptibility to kanamycin induced cochleotoxicity in a cohort of patients undergoing MDR/RR-TB treatment*

Nazanin Ghafari holds a BSc qualification from Shahid Beheshti University, Iran and a MSc qualification from UCT. She started her PhD (Audiology) in the Department of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences at UCT in 2016.

Nazanin Ghafari's thesis focused on genetic and pharmacokinetic factors that may increase susceptibility to hearing loss as a side effect, following MDR/RR-TB treatment with kanamycin. Her thesis revealed that over 80% of the patients receiving kanamycin developed hearing loss. Her research also found that longer duration of treatment with kanamycin and higher kanamycin AUC₀₋₁₀ (area under the curve) were strongly associated with an increased incidence of hearing loss. Her research also showed that the *T15312C* and *T10114C* are common mutations amongst South African MDR/RR-TB patients and these mutations may be potentially pathogenic for hearing loss. These findings can be useful in contributing towards the development of a more effective index that can

potentially help with individualisation of drug therapy for MDR/RR-TB as well as reliable identification of patients who may not be suitable for treatment with aminoglycoside pharmacotherapy because of the risk of developing hearing loss from such treatment.

Rudranil Hazra
Thesis Title: *Protein kinase C - delta (PKC- δ): a critical hub for immunomodulatory functions in macrophages during Mycobacterium tuberculosis infection*

Rudranil Hazra holds a BTech (Molecular Biology, Cell Biology, Immunology) and MTech (Biotechnology) qualifications from the KIIT University, India. In 2019, he began full-time study towards his PhD in Clinical Science and Immunology.

Rudranil Hazra's thesis reports the effect of specific targeting of PKC δ in human and mouse macrophages and whole animal models during tuberculosis. He went on to find that activation of PKC-delta controls TB in macrophages. Conversely, targeting of PKC δ in human macrophages increased Mtb growth and reduced their ability to induce host protective inflammatory response. He found that the susceptibility to TB is due to the defects in macrophage intrinsic mechanisms. The whole animal model lacking PKC δ in macrophages showed increased mycobacterial growth with exacerbated lung pathology and dissemination at the chronic stage. He further reported that PKC-delta expression correlated with the disease in bronchoalveolar lavage samples from TB patients. This implies PKC δ is a key hub for immunomodulatory functions during TB infection. He concludes that the activators of PKC-delta and the target genes of this kinase in macrophages would significantly benefit the treatment of TB.

Stephen Nzeki Kamuli
Thesis Title: *The molecular genetics of familial cardiomyopathy*

Stephen Kamuli completed his BSc in 2013 at the University of Nairobi. He then moved to UCT where he registered for his MSc in the Cardiovascular Genetics laboratory and in 2016, he graduated with a *cum laude*. Shortly thereafter, he enrolled for his PhD.

Stephen Kamuli's thesis investigates three South African families who are severely affected with heart muscle disease. The cause of the heart disease is usually a spelling mistake or "mutation" in the DNA, which is inherited from one generation to the next. Two of the families had severe dilated cardiomyopathy (DCM) and one family had severe arrhythmogenic cardiomyopathy (ACM). Stephen used cutting edge technologies such as whole exome sequencing and targeted sequencing to find the mutation within these families. He discovered a new gene for primary heart muscle disease called *DMPK* and his research was the first to find the same *BAG3* mutation in three different patients in South Africa, this could point to a common ancestor hundreds of years ago. Though his research we are now able to offer genetic counselling to these families and help them treat their disease better.

Aida Nakayiwa Kawuma
Thesis Title: *Pharmacometrics of dolutegravir and tenofovir: a quantitative approach to characterise drug-drug interactions, pharmacogenetics and optimise treatment*

Aida Kawuma trained as a pharmacist at Makerere University in Uganda, where she also obtained a master's degree in pharmacology. She has hands-on clinical research experience over several years as a study pharmacist, coordinator, and project manager at a clinical research unit in Uganda.

Aida Kawuma's thesis employs mathematical modelling to improve HIV treatment using data from healthy volunteers and people living with HIV, some also co-infected with tuberculosis. She characterised the pharmacokinetics and pharmacogenetics of dolutegravir and focused on its drug-drug interaction with the antituberculosis drugs rifampicin and rifabutin and with the antimalarial drugs artemether-lumefantrine and artesunate-amodiaquine. She also described the pharmacokinetics of tenofovir when dosed as either tenofovir disoproxil fumarate or tenofovir alafenamide in South Africans living with HIV.

Nafisa Essop Mayat

Thesis Title: *A case study exploring disability inclusion within the Muslim Ummah in South Africa*

Nafisa Mayat holds a BA in Social Work (UKZN), an Honours degree in Psychology (UNISA) and a MA in Disability Studies (UCT). She began her PhD studies part-time with the Disability Studies Programme at UCT in 2015.

Nafisa Mayat's thesis explains how disability inclusion is interpreted, experienced, and enacted within the Muslim Ummah in South Africa. The study focuses on the experiences of persons within the Muslim Ummah around disability inclusion. The conceptual framework that underpinned this study was the Capability Approach together with perspectives of Ableism and De-Coloniality. What emerged from this study was the dominant ableist, normative, colonial narrative prevailing within the Muslim Ummah in South Africa and its impact on the process of attainment of full inclusion for Muslims with disabilities in the country. The study highlights the significant spaces and places where this unconscious exclusion is evident. It is proposed that in order to achieve full inclusion and belonging for people with disabilities within the Ummah, there should be

a re-shaping in the thinking around disability by generating new knowledge and by challenging the dominance of the normative, ableist narrative.

Tebogo Adelaide Mokganyetji

Thesis Title: *Raising perinatally infected adolescents and young people: reflections from HIV-positive adolescents and young people and their guardians in Cape Town, South Africa*

Tebogo Mokganyetji is a development studies graduate with an MA in Rural Development and BA in Youth Development from the University of Venda, South Africa. She joined UCT's School of Public Health and Family Medicine in 2016. Tebogo Mokganyetji is a youth development specialist focusing on adolescent HIV.

Tebogo Mokganyetji's thesis explores the social context for children and adolescents born with HIV and how their treatment experiences and practices impact HIV management and prevention. The research highlights the importance of early and supported disclosure of HIV status to youth and how effective disclosure is closely linked to health-seeking and health-promoting behavior and overall treatment adherence. The thesis also shows how people use different forms and combinations of healing systems including African healing systems, religious beliefs, and biomedical care to keep themselves healthy. Through this research, she demonstrates the importance of context-specific HIV management and prevention interventions for youth growing up with HIV.

Metoboroghene Oluwaseyi Mowoe

Thesis Title: *Catching cancer creeping: proteomic discovery and validation of an autoantibody biomarker panel for the differential diagnosis of pancreatic ductal adenocarcinoma*

Metoboroghene Mowoe completed her BSc (Hons) in Biological Sciences and Masters in Zoology qualifications at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, and began her PhD studies at UCT in the Department of Integrative Biomedical Sciences in 2018.

Metoboroghene Mowoe's thesis reports on the identification and validation of an autoantibody-based 14 diagnostic biomarker panel for pancreatic cancer, for which there is currently no effective method of early diagnosis. To identify this panel and enable its effective implementation, she developed a statistical pipeline as well as a cost-effective method of pancreatic cancer screening using dried blood spots. In addition, she developed a method of isolating extracellular vesicles for the possible identification of more accurate diagnostic biomarkers of cancers in the future. These findings may be the key to the early detection of pancreatic cancer after decades of reliance on a combination of less-than-ideal diagnostic techniques and markers.

Viantha Naidoo

Thesis Title: *Islet growth, vascularisation and innervation in a regenerating pancreas following 85-90% partial pancreatectomy*

Viantha Naidoo completed her BSc and BSc (Hons) studies in the Department of Molecular and Cell Biology at UCT. She began full-time study towards her PhD in 2015 in the Department of Human Biology, after completing her NRF research internship.

Viantha Naidoo's thesis investigates the established 90% partial pancreatectomy (PPx) rat model to determine if pancreatic islets in the regenerated adult pancreas can attain structural maturity of the neurovascular

components, which are essential for islet function. She reports on the macroscopic and microscopic findings at 30 and 90 days post PPx, showing substantial growth of the regenerating pancreas in adult rats that continues beyond 30 days. She performs comprehensive two- and three-dimensional image analyses of multi-immunostained tissues, presenting novel findings that demonstrate a close to normal islet neurovascular composition, correlating with the normal blood glucose and insulin levels observed by 90 days post PPx. This suggests that endogenous factors released during pancreas regeneration may recapitulate normal islet development and maturity, potentially improving longevity above other models. Future studies identifying molecular factors underlying the islet neurovascular formation in the PPx model may lead to novel therapeutic strategies for diabetes.

Rofhiwa Nesamari
Thesis Title: *Studies on CD4+ T cell subsets in Mycobacterium tuberculosis immunity during HIV co-infection*

Rofhiwa Nesamari completed her BSc in Genetics, Biochemistry and Microbiology at UCT and her BScHons and MSc in Microbiology at the University of Pretoria. Thereafter, she commenced her PhD in the Division of Medical Virology at UCT.

Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection is the greatest risk factor for developing active tuberculosis (TB). Previous studies have demonstrated that there is rapid depletion of *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* (*M.tb*)-specific CD4+ T cell responses within the first year of HIV infection. This early defect targeting the immunological response to TB may explain the elevated risk of TB even prior to substantial immunosuppression. Rofhiwa Nesamari's thesis investigates *M.tb*-specific CD4+ T cell responses during

the course of HIV infection, from acute infection till after antiretroviral therapy (ART) initiation. Her thesis provides a detailed assessment of the impact of early ART on TB immunity. Results of her study confirm and extend previous findings of depletion of *M.tb*-specific CD4+ T cells within the first 3 months of HIV infection. Her thesis also provides further insights into the role of early ART in preserving TB immunity and reducing the elevated risk of TB in HIV infected individuals.

Natasha Lee North
Thesis Title: *Development of a process to support stakeholder engaged children's nursing workforce planning for high-need, lower-resourced Primary Health Care systems in Malawi*

Natasha North is a nurse who completed her BA (Hons) in Social Policy at Goldsmiths College, University of London, and her MSc (Med) in Paediatrics at UCT. Natasha commenced her PhD in 2019 while working in the Harry Crossley Children's Nursing Development Unit, Department of Paediatrics, UCT.

Natasha North's thesis focuses on specialist and advanced practice nursing roles in African health systems. Role confusion has been shown to detract from the successful introduction of advanced nursing roles. Working in close collaboration with the professional community of child health nurses in Malawi, Natasha analysed nursing roles in Malawi and other African health systems, finding substantive differences with globally advocated role descriptions. Natasha used these insights to develop a flexible framework intended to help nurses and other stakeholders manage the development of advanced and specialist roles at the levels of individual nurses, institutions and health systems.

Sincengile Nokubonga Ntshingila
Thesis Title: *Screening of novel inhibitors of 5 alpha-reductase type 2 as potential treatments for androgenetic alopecia*

Sincengile Ntshingila completed her BSc and MSc qualifications at the University of Pretoria in 2006. She began full-time study for her PhD in 2018.

Sincengile Ntshingila's thesis reports the screening of novel compounds for their ability to inhibit 5 alpha-reductase type 2, to be used in treating androgenetic alopecia (AGA). She used a structure-based design model to screen compounds in the same class as the FDA approved drug for androgenetic alopecia. The search for alternative therapeutics for androgenetic alopecia, specifically inhibitors of SRD5A2, identified and validated compound BSY as an SRD5A2 inhibitor and a potential treatment option for AGA. A patent for the drug is under filing.

Trishana Nundalall
Thesis Title: *Establishment of recombinant antibody technologies allowing for the generation of SNAP-tag fusion proteins*

Trishana Nundalall completed her BSc (Hons) and MSc qualifications at UCT, and began full-time study towards her PhD in 2017.

Trishana Nundalall's thesis exploits the use of cutting-edge technologies to develop a methodology for the generation of diagnostic and therapeutic antibody fusion proteins partially tailored towards Triple negative breast cancer. By combining antibody identification tools with SNAP-tag technology, Trishana Nundalall produced a panel of fusion proteins that were successfully conjugated to fluorescent substrates which could be visualized by optical imaging systems, providing a potentially predictive biomarker characterization tool for breast cancer. She then demonstrated the versatility of

the methodology by generating a Zika virus specific fusion protein, which was successfully conjugated to a fluorescent substrate while maintaining its specific binding capacity for Zika virus antigens. Replacing the fluorescent substrates with cytotoxic drugs could provide a highly selective delivery system for specific killing of biomarker expressing cells. This study demonstrates the value of recombinant antibody technologies in the generation of precision diagnostics and therapeutics for diseases currently lacking therapeutic options.

Javan Ochieng Okendo

Thesis Title: *In-depth analysis of complex clinical proteomic data and integration with other OMICs data sets in a clinical study of TB susceptibility*

Javan Okendo completed his BSc in Molecular biology from Kenyatta University in Kenya and an MSc in Computational Biology and Bioinformatics at UCT which was awarded with distinction. He later joined the Chemical and Systems biology division at UCT in 2019 for his PhD studies.

Javan Okendo's thesis focuses on answering the fundamental and poorly understood question of what constitute protection and susceptibility to tuberculosis infection. Using proteomics data from individuals with a gradient of TB infections to answer this question, Javan investigated the performance of peptide spectral matching (PSM) search engines of a complex proteomic samples showing that the underlying biological information from the proteomic data remains the same irrespective of PSM search engine used. He then profiled the bronchoalveolar lavage fluid (BALF) proteome and demonstrated that intra-lung challenge with live BCG and PPD results in a neutrophil-driven proteomic response in BALF according to exposure *M. tuberculosis*. Metaproteomic profiling of BALF in individuals with gradient of TB infection further demonstrated that short-chain fatty acid producers could play a role in protecting and containing TB in individuals. The findings in his

thesis will be useful in improving the TB management and vaccines development strategies.

Fidilia Millicent Achieng Omondi

Thesis Title: *Influence of helminth infection on vaginal immunity*

Fidilia Omondi holds a BSc degree in Microbiology and Biotechnology from the University of Nairobi, Kenya and an MSc degree in Medical Virology from UCT. She began her PhD studies in 2018.

Fidilia Omondi's thesis explores the influence of hookworm infection on immunity in the female reproductive tract (FRT) and risk of Human Papillomavirus (HPV) infection in humans. She compares the prevalence of HPV infection between hookworm infected and uninfected women and finds that women with hookworm infection are at an increased risk of HPV infection. She then uses multiplex immunological assays to measure and compare levels of immune markers in the FRT of women with only hookworm or HPV infection, co-infected and uninfected women. She finds that hookworm infection alters immunity in the female reproductive tract and this alteration is pronounced in hookworm and HPV co-infected women. She also explores the impact of hookworm infection on vaccine mediated immunity to Herpes Simplex Virus Type 2 (HSV-2) in a mouse model and finds that hookworm co-infection dampens the vaccine mediated immune response to HSV-2.

Jenna Patterson

Thesis Title: *Evidence-based vaccinology: supporting evidence-informed considerations to introduce routine hepatitis A immunization in South Africa*

Jenna Patterson has a BSc in Public Health from the College of Charleston, USA and an MPH qualification from UCT. She began full-time study towards her PhD in 2017.

Jenna Patterson's thesis investigates whether a routine vaccination program against the hepatitis A virus should be introduced into the South African Expanded Programme on Immunisation. The investigations utilised diverse methods to collect different types of evidence. From the investigations that yielded up to date evidence, the results show implementation of a single-dose hepatitis A vaccination campaign in children under two years of age would produce significant health gains and reduce mortality associated with the virus in South Africa. However, the vaccination program would not be cost-effective against the current South African threshold. Jenna Patterson produced a user-friendly decision-making application for further deliberations on hepatitis A prevention policies in South Africa. Key outputs of this thesis contribute to the knowledge base on hepatitis A epidemiology.

Ditshego Benjamin Ralefeta

Thesis Title: *Investigating the impact of mycobacterial cell-cell heterogeneity on susceptibility to anti-tuberculosis (TB) chemotherapy*

Ditshego Ralefeta completed his BSc in Biochemistry and Microbiology in 2012, BSc (Hons) in Microbiology and Biotechnology (2013) and MSc (Med) in 2016, before commencing fulltime study towards his PhD in 2019.

Ditshego Ralefeta's thesis utilises a panel of transcriptional reporter mutants in combination with single-cell fluorescence microscopy, fluorescence-activated cell sorting and drug sensitivity assays to investigate the possibility that a sub-population of "SOS-active" cells might give rise to drug resistance. Ditshego Ralefeta generated and validated a mutasome transcription reporter strain. Ditshego Ralefeta demonstrated by single-cell fluorescence microscopy and flow cytometry that mutasome induction is heterogeneous in mitomycin C stressed bioreporter strain, such that four distinct sub-populations were detected: SOS-positive, unresponsive, *recA*-positive and *dnaE2*-positive. Single cells were obtained by FACS for downstream assessment of fitness and mutagenic advantage. Time-kill curves with ciprofloxacin and moxifloxacin for the four sub-populations were similar to that of the wild type strain. The four sub-populations displayed ≤ 4 -fold increase in MIC for linezolid and vancomycin. High rifampicin mutation frequencies were recorded for the *recA*-positive and *dnaE2*-positive subpopulations.

Zarinah Sunday
Thesis Title: *Identification of a novel HIV-1C protease from a microbial source*

Zarinah Sunday completed her BSc and BSc Med (Hons) at the University of the Western Cape, before enrolling for a master's degree at UCT and upgrading to PhD in 2010.

Zarinah Sunday's thesis concerns the development of novel inhibitors of the HIV protease as putative drug candidates. Based on concepts

from the directed evolution field, this thesis builds and validates an in vivo life-or-death selection system and uses this system to enrich a novel microbial protein inhibitor of the HIV-C protease. The candidate HIV-C protease inhibitor was identified, cloned, expressed and characterised by enzymology methods to verify the selectivity of its inhibitory activity. These findings provide proof of concept for the identification of highly selective HIV protease inhibitors that may be less susceptible to viral escape.

Caitlin Rosemarie Whittaker
Thesis Title: *Barriers to tuberculosis drug discovery: the mycobacterial cell wall*

Caitlin Whittaker completed her BSc in Biochemistry and Genetics in 2015 and her BSc Med (Hons) in Infectious Diseases and Immunology in the first class in 2016, before commencing full-time study towards her PhD in 2017.

Caitlin Whittaker's thesis combines the use of biorthogonal ("click") chemistry, fluorescence microscopy, and proteomics to investigate the mycobacterial cell wall as a barrier to drug permeation. The innovative application of click chemistry offers an inexpensive and easily implementable method for the empirical validation of potential drug-like compounds for new anti-tuberculosis drug discovery. The second part of this work utilizes chemical stripping and time-lapse imaging to observe the formation of cell wall-deficient mycobacterial mutants. In establishing the capacity of mycobacteria to survive without a cell wall, this research highlights the potential relevance of altered morphological states and structures in mycobacterial pathogenicity. In combination, these findings aid in elucidating the role of the mycobacterial cell wall in both compound permeation and survival of the organism.

Kyle Willard
Thesis Title: *Investigating the involvement of proteoglycans in musculoskeletal soft tissue injuries at a genetic and a functional level*

Kyle Willard completed a BSc (Hons), and MSc in Plant Biotechnology at Stellenbosch University, and began full-time study towards a PhD in 2014.

Kyle Willard's thesis reports the analyses of DNA sequences in proteoglycan genes with risk of Achilles tendon injury and went further to characterise a plausible mechanism for some of these risks in associated regions within the proteoglycan genes. The experiments included in this thesis provide novel, preliminary, evidence of the involvement of proteoglycans in altered susceptibility to ATI at a genetic and functional level. It also suggests that miRNA regulation of fibril formation may in part play a role in the mechanism underpinning ATI susceptibility. Kyle Willard's thesis noted functional differences in the expression of major homeostasis regulators associated with specific genetic risk profiles. The collective findings from this thesis implicate *ACAN* and *BGN* genes to play a role in contributing to collagen fibril integrity and thereby in part to injury susceptibility.

Abdoulaye Yalcouye
Thesis Title: *Genetics of hearing impairment and peripheral neuropathy in Mali*

Abdoulaye Yalcouye holds a MD degree in Neurology from the University of Sciences, Techniques and Technologies of Bamako (USTTB), Mali. He joined the Faculty of Health Sciences at UCT in 2019 for his PhD studies. Before joining UCT, he worked in the Laboratory of Neurogenetics (USTTB) in Mali.

Abdoulaye Yalcouye's thesis focuses on the genetic studies of congenital hearing impairment and peripheral neuropathy in Mali. He started his research with a community engagement activity, by visiting schools for the deaf and performing a clinical characterization of the patients and laboratory analysis. He then collected peripheral blood and extracted DNA samples for genetic studies using different genetic testing approaches. His research has identified several novel variants in genes implicated in hearing impairment and peripheral neuropathies. He also extended his research to the environmental factors that are involved in hearing impairment in Mali and found meningitis to be the most common cause. Abdoulaye Yalcouye's research highlights the urgent need to invest in preventing infectious diseases such as meningitis and conducting large scale genetic studies in Africa. These findings will contribute to shaping early diagnosis and care, as well as future therapeutic development strategies in Africa.

The gown and sleeves are lined with pale blue silk and the sleeves are looped up in front with a gold cord and button. The yoke of the gown is edged with gold cord. The gown is worn with a square blue velvet hat with a soft crown and gold tassel.

VICE-CHANCELLOR

The Vice-Chancellor wears a gown made from bright blue silk. The front of the gown has facings down each side and sleeve-linings of pale blue silk. The sleeves are looped up in front with a gold cord and button and the yoke of the gown is edged with gold cord. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a silver cord.

DEPUTY VICE-CHANCELLOR

A Deputy Vice-Chancellor wears a gown made from dark blue silk. The gown has closed sleeves with an inverted T-shaped opening at the level of the elbow to free the arms. The front of the gown has facings of light blue down each side. The sleeves are lined with light blue and the yoke of the gown is edged with silver cord. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a silver cord.

CHAIR OF COUNCIL

The Chair of Council wears a gown, of the same pattern as that worn by the Vice-Chancellor, made from light blue silk. The front of the gown has facings down each side and a yoke of dark blue. The sleeves are lined with dark blue and the facings and yoke are trimmed with gold cord. The sleeves are looped up in front with a gold cord and button. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a gold tassel.

MEMBERS OF COUNCIL

Members of Council wear graduate-pattern gowns made from black silk. The front of the gown has 10cm wide, light blue facings down each side trimmed with dark blue cord. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a blue cord.

REGISTRAR

The Registrar wears a gown made from black silk. The front of the gown has 10cm wide facings of blue silk down each side. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a white cord.

PRESIDENT OF CONVOCATION

The President of Convocation wears a gown made from black silk and has long closed sleeves with an inverted T-shaped opening at the level of the elbow to free the arms. The front of the gown has facings down each side and sleeves of blue silk. The gown is worn with a black velvet bonnet with a blue tassel.

ACADEMIC DRESS (continued)

GOWNS

A plain black gown styled after the pattern of the Oxford scholar's gown is worn by diplomats, and Bachelor's, Honours and Master's graduands. Senior doctoral graduands wear a scarlet gown, with facings the colour distinctive of the faculty in which the degree is awarded. PhD graduands wear a scarlet gown without facings.

HOODS

The hood is particular to the qualification and the faculty. Diplomates and Bachelor's graduands wear a black hood lined with white and edged with the colour distinctive of the faculty. Master's graduands wear a black hood lined with the colour distinctive of the faculty and edged with white, except in the case of the hood for the MMed degree, which is edged with red. Senior doctoral graduands wear a hood of the colour distinctive of the faculty and a black velvet bonnet with a cord of the colour distinctive of the faculty in which the degrees is awarded. PhD graduands wear a hood of scarlet lined with black and a black velvet bonnet with a cord of the colour distinctive of the faculty in which the degree is awarded.
