Funding and duration of funding: Proposals can request up to £300,000 and must not exceed 3 years.

Funder deadline: 25 September 2024

The Medical Research Foundation invites collaborative applications from pairs of mid-career researchers in sub-Saharan Africa and the UK. The projects should focus on the impact of climate change on health, aiming to develop new collaborations or solidify existing partnerships. Research should address mechanisms and processes involved in the impact of climate change on health, including infectious and non-infectious diseases affecting sub-Saharan Africa.

Research proposals in the broad area of the impact of climate change on health could include, but are not limited to:

- understanding the biological mechanisms underpinning the impact on human health of climate change
- the development and implementation of treatments for climate-change related illnesses
- understanding and reducing the impact of climate change on health and well-being.

Research into climate change itself, that does not consider impacts on health outcomes, is not within the scope of this funding call.

General Eligibility: Applications should represent a collaborative project between a mid-career researcher who is a national of and based in a sub-Saharan African country, from an organisation with an established legal entity in sub-Saharan Africa, and a mid-career UK-based researcher at an eligible institution (UK HEIs, Research Council research institutes, hospitals, and other independent research organisations). Nationality and country of residence/employment may be different.

- Research Focus: Proposals must study the impact of climate change on health.
- **Principal Investigators:** Must be mid-career researchers from sub-Saharan Africa and the UK. They must hold a PhD, DPhil, or MD, and be transitioning to research independence.
- Collaborations: Proposals should reflect equitable and mutually beneficial partnerships.

Specific Eligibility Criteria:

- Sub-Saharan Africa-based Researchers: Must be nationals of a sub-Saharan African country and based in an organization with an established legal entity in sub-Saharan Africa.
- UK-based Researchers: Must be based at eligible institutions (UK HEIs, Research Council research institutes, hospitals, and other independent research organizations).
