The Academy seeks to support policy-relevant research across a range of themes, including:

- Environmental Resilience and Climate Action
- Pandemic Preparedness
- Power and Voice in Climate Action
- Societal Challenges and Approaches to Responsible Technologies
- Social Determinants of Health

- <u>Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation Led by or Actively Involving Indigenous Peoples and</u> Local Communities

- The Academy supports projects that deliver clear insights and actionable outcomes at local, national, or regional levels in eligible countries.

Application Process:
