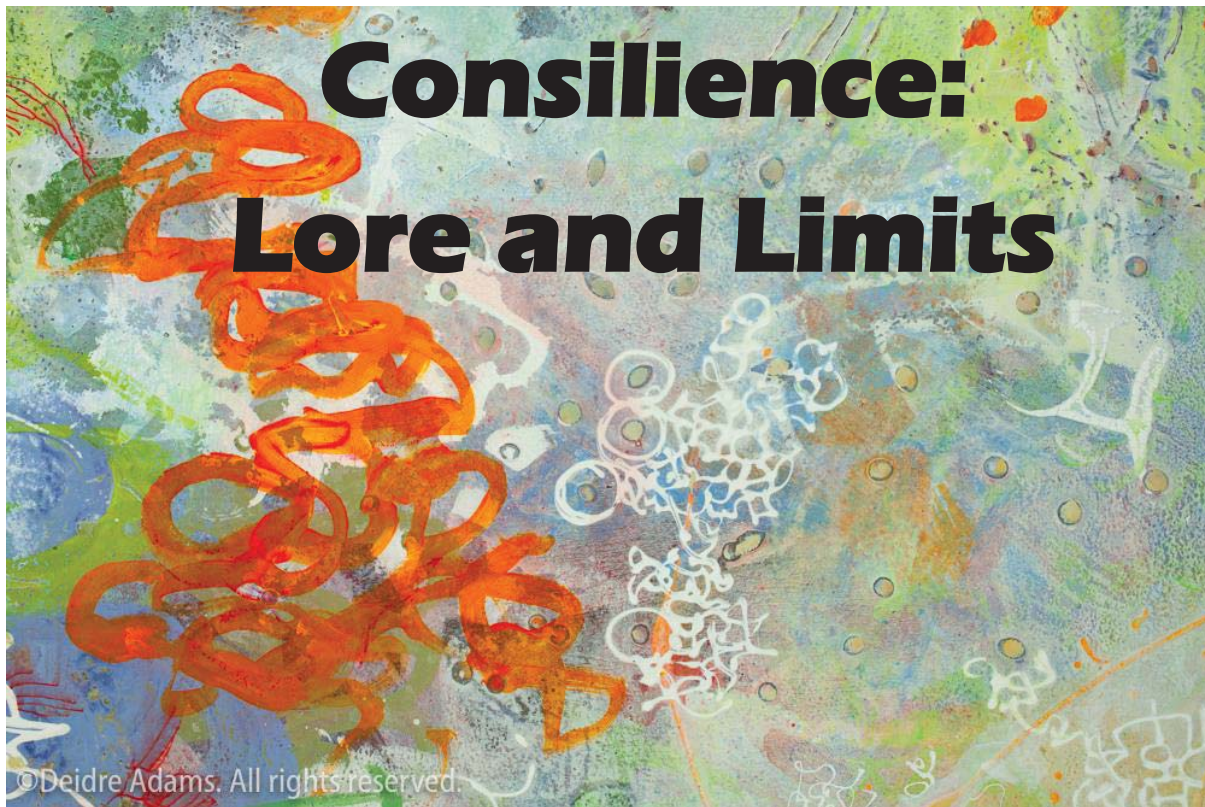


INVITATION TO THE 2019 SEMINAR SERIES ON

The term “consilience” has come to be associated with two linked ideas: not only can discovery be confirmed by different sources, but the putative boundaries between sciences, humanities and the arts mask an underlying unity. Along this spectrum of meanings lies the possibility of a grand, unified epistemology, offering scholars seamless discovery of knowledge, without the stultifying markers of discipline. This raises important questions about the possibilities of a consilient scholarship, the cost of *not* pursuing interdisciplinary unity, and challenges along the way.

In this discussion, Prof Anwar Mall gives an overview of the origins of consilience, explaining its overall urgency. He is joined by Neil Horne who presents a critical perspective.
