### **FAQ – Safety & Security During Power Outages**

What should I do when using Lifts on Campus	<ul> <li>Watch your step entering and exiting a lift.</li> <li>Step aside and allow passengers exiting to get off.</li> <li>Press the "door open" button to hold the doors open.</li> <li>Check the posted maximum capacity of lifts, do not overload.</li> <li>Discourage unsafe behaviour by others in and around lifts.</li> <li>Report any lift-related accidents and vandalism promptly.</li> <li>When pressing the landing lift buttons, only press the direction that you are going, not both buttons.</li> </ul>	
What should <b>NOT</b> be done when using Lifts on campus	<ul> <li>Do not use your hand or leg to stop the doors from closing.</li> <li>Do not lean on lift door.</li> <li>Do not jump up and down inside a lift.</li> <li>Do not cram into a lift that is exceeding its capacity.</li> <li>Be aware of other people travelling in the lift and refrain from pushing, shouting or using bad language.</li> <li>Refrain from eating or drinking in the lift.</li> <li>In case of an emergency, do not use the lifts.</li> </ul>	and another and another and another and another anothe
Can I use the Lifts During Loadshedding?	<ul> <li>Make Sure you know the Loadshedding times before using the lifts by downloading the Eskom se Push app.</li> <li>Do not use lift 10 minutes before or after a scheduled loadshedding or power outage.</li> </ul>	<b>®</b> €skom
What should I do if I am stuck in a lift?	<ul> <li>In an emergency, press the alarm button which will dial to Maintenance call centre / CPS.</li> <li>Remain calm and call the emergency number displayed in the lift.</li> <li>Keep away from the lift door in case rescue personnel open it.</li> <li>NEVER ATTEMPT TO CRAWL, JUMP OR CLIMB OUT OF A LIFT BETWEEN FLOORS.</li> <li>Wait for emergency personnel for assistance.</li> </ul>	IN EMERGENCY PUSH

Is there power back up during Electrical power outages?  What if there is no power back up system	<ul> <li>Some buildings do have Back-up generator that will power access control, lights &amp; selected critical items.</li> <li>Access systems has battery back-up but can fail – depending on usage frequency of loadshedding.</li> <li>Building may have emergency battery pack lighting but only to aid exit.</li> <li>Back-up generator (no) – decision to evacuate rests with HOD.</li> <li>All mag-locked doors (mostly exits) have green breakglasses.</li> </ul>	Red & Green Break Glasses at Emergency Exit
	<ul> <li>Some access doors have thumb-turn overrides.</li> <li>All Fire escape/ exit doors / fire route exit doors will have Red fire break-glasses as last resort</li> </ul>	
What should I do if there is a sudden power outage and there is no power backup?	<ul> <li>Locate the evacuation passages – will be signposted.</li> <li>Find access or exit doors – also signposted.</li> <li>Exit and follow the signs until you leave the building.</li> <li>The evacuation signs are luminescent but rely on available light to be activated, therefore evacuation should essentially be within an hour, especially if there is no emergency lighting.</li> </ul>	EXIT A
What happens to the access-controlled doors if there is no power?	When there is no power or the backup battery runs down then the doors are automatically released.  Maglock doors – will release when the batteries are drained	
	Strike lock doors – will engage when the batteries are depleted (thumb turn override or Green Break Glass override)	
	Access control Main Controller loose memory due to depleted batteries and must be reprogrammed by a 3 <sup>rd</sup> party contractor.	
What is in place to prevent non entry into access-controlled doors if they automatically release?	<ul> <li>In this instance, persons in the buildings are to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity or persons entering the building or venue.</li> <li>CPS will continue with mobile and foot patrolling</li> </ul>	





## **FAQ – Safety and Security During Power Outages**

What happens if the door Mechanism stays locked during Power outages and persons cannot exit a venue/building?

- Doors have emergency release buttons or thumb knobs.
- If door is locked, locate thumb turn (waist or shoulder high) or green break-glass and activate.



 As a last resort, the red fire break-glass can also be used to release access and exit doors.
