The Public Health Alliance for Genomic Epidemiology (PHA4GE) is a global organization that aims to develop standards for and promote the use of routine sequencing for pathogen surveillance and response. PHA4GE promotes standardization, portability and reproducibility of assays and workflows, advances the use of open data and open source in public health and aims to improve surveillance and outbreak response capabilities. As part of the organization, the Training and Workforce Development working group is helping to promote collaboration and foster the development of the global public health bioinformatics work force. The group has been awarded a new grant to coordinate training activities, develop curricula and create communities of trainers and trainees. We require a training programme manager to manage the activities of the grant, which also include engagement with relevant stakeholders. Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for an **18 month**, **fixed term contract** position of a Training Programme Manager (Pathogen Bioinformatics), **for appointment as soon as possible.** The position will be situated in the Computational Biology Division, which is in the Department of Integrative Biomedical Sciences and the Institute of Infectious Disease & Molecular Medicine, Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Cape Town. There may be a possibility for renewal subject to availability of funding.

Minimum Requirements:

- Postgraduate degree in Bioinformatics, Public Health, Epidemiology Genomics or a related scientific domain
- 2 years of working experience in the biological/biomedical/public health and/or training field if holding a Masters degree, or 4 years of experience if holding an Honours degree
- Demonstrated experience in project management
- Evidence of organizational skills
- Good administrative and time management skills
- MS Office Suite, G-suite applications (especially Word and Excel, google sheets, google docs, forms)
- Good communication and written skills

Responsibilities:

- Manage the training and outreach activities within the PHA4GE Training and Workforce Development working group

- Develop platforms/forums for building trainer and trainee communities
- Monitor and report on project deliverables
