The Department of Student Affairs (DSA), through its Student Wellness Service (SWS) at UCT, is seeking a qualified person for the role of **Clinical Nurse Practitioner (CNP)** full-time for an appointment as soon as possible. The post reports to the Principal Nurse Practitioner.

A successful candidate will provide clinical, educational and advocacy interventions appropriate to the scope of a Primary Health Care Nurse (PHC) within a student-centered and professional multidisciplinary primary health care service.

The CNP Nurse must always follow the South African Nursing Council regulations and promote the institutional and departmental mission and values within SWS.

Requirements

- Relevant NQF 8 Nursing qualification, i.e. Nurse (General, Psychiatric & Community) and Midwife and Clinical Nursing Science, health assessment, treatment and care.
- Three years post-qualifying experience in the Primary Health Care field, of which two years must be within a health care context in which advanced level counselling and mental health were vital to the job.
- Current registration with the South African Nursing Council (SANC)
- Possession of a dispensing license or willingness to acquire such within six months of appointment.
- Good interpersonal skills and a mature work ethic
- Personal accountability and commitment with a strong interest in and an empathic attitude to students as clients
- Flexibility and adaptability to the emerging needs of the environment
- Must be able to work within a multidisciplinary team and be able to work under pressure in a demanding context.

Advantageous:

- Experience in working in a Higher Education environment.
- Fluency in one or more indigenous languages
- Possession of Reproductive Health Certificate

Responsibilities:

- Participate effectively in a responsive service that is student-centred, transformative, and aligned to a Primary Health Care orientation and philosophy in delivering health services.
- Providing clinic support rotationally in-between different satellite clinic locations of SWS
Provide a comprehensive, holistic approach to the clinical management of all presenting patients to ensure their health needs are addressed timeously.
- Participating in health promotion activities of the team as delegated by Line Management
- Manage the psychosocial and health requirements impacting academic performance to ensure early detection and referral.
- Performing all required administrative tasks as delegated by Line Management
