The Department of Public Law, within the Faculty of Law, invites applications for an academic appointment to the level of Lecturer / Senior Lecturer with particular expertise in **marine and environmental law**, to commence employment as soon as possible.

We wish to appoint an applicant with a qualification and experience in the field of marine and environmental law to join the academic staff in the Institute of Marine and Environmental Law ([www.imel.uct.ac.za](http://www.imel.uct.ac.za)). The appointee should be able to teach across a range of topics in marine and environmental law at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, and to supervise/co-supervise postgraduate student projects in these fields. Specific interest and expertise in marine law generally and the international law of the sea in particular would be very desirable.

#### Candidates suitable for appointment as a **Lecturer** must have:

- At least a Master's degree (NQF 9 level qualification) with a strong academic record, specialising in, or relevant to, the fields of marine and environmental law;
- Lecturing experience in fields of marine and environmental law and/or other relevant work experience; and
- Evidence of research and publications in the fields of marine and environmental law.

#### Candidates suitable for appointment as a **Senior Lecturer** must have:

- At least a Master's degree (NQF 9 level qualification) with a strong academic record, specialising in, or relevant to, the fields of marine and environmental law;
- Lecturing experience in the fields of marine and environmental law and/or other relevant work experience;
- Evidence of ability effectively to supervise academic research, including postgraduate student projects;
- An established research record with publications in the fields of marine and environmental law; and
- Evidence of active contribution to Department-level administration (or equivalent).

#### Advantageous:

- PhD (NQF 10 level qualification) specialising in marine and environmental law or working towards completion of a PhD;
- Postdoctoral experience.

#### Responsibilities:

- Teaching undergraduate and postgraduate courses offered by the Department of Public Law in international and domestic marine and environmental law as required by the Department, including courses offered outside of the Faculty of Law.
- Postgraduate student supervision (as appropriate to the level of appointment).
- Maintaining a research profile and publication output (as appropriate to the level of appointment).
- Contributing to Faculty and Department activities and administration (as appropriate to the level of appointment).
