



7 KEY THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT **FUNDING YOUR POSTGRADUATE**

BE FLEXIBLE. Financial assistance for postgraduates comes in various forms. Some are administered by the university and others by external agencies and donors. Be sure to investigate a range of options.

KEEP THOSE MARKS UP. Many postgraduate awards are based on either academic merit alon or a combination of financial need and merit. While there are awards based only on financial need, the better your academic scores, the more awards are available.

PLAN AHEAD. Start looking for funding opportunities well in advance. Opportunities for funding are often announced months before the deadline to register for your degree (e.g., in the year preceding the start of your postgraduate studies).

GATHER AS MUCH INFORMATION AS POSSIBLE.

The Postgraduate Funding Office (PGFO) offers a range of material to help you find funding for your studies. Booklets, such as this one, and handbooks can be obtained from the PGFO or downloaded from the Postgrad Hub.

PREPARE FOR A BALANCING ACT. With the exception of some prestigious scholarships and a specific group of UCT-supported, full-cost awards, full financial support via a single award is rare. This means financing your postgraduate studies is likely to involve a combination of bursaries, part-time employment and loans. Bear in mind, some awards cannot be held concurrently with others. So, when you plan, consider as many sources of support

ASK FOR HELP. The PGFO is within easy walking distance of most faculties and departments on Upper Campus Our staff are there to advise you on the diverse funding opportunities available to postgraduates and help with the submission of applications. Also speak to researchers and potential supervisors as they may have access to grantholder bursaries

IMPORTANT POINTS TO CONSIDER REGARDING **FUNDING ELIGIBILITY**

Postgraduate funding is not automatically granted based on admission to UCT or as a follow-on to the undergraduate funding you may have had. There are many awards, each with specific criteria and rules that must be fulfilled/matched. Hence there is an application process for all awards, including deadlines for submission dates, which must be adhered to.

To be considered for postgraduate funding, prospective students must have applied for an academic place at UCT (in addition to applying for funding).

Currently, students registering only for full-time honours, masters and doctoral degrees are eligible to apply for funding. Students who register for postgraduate diplomas and certificates, the BArch, the LLB or for the fourth year of any bachelor degree are not eligible for postgraduate awards.

Students who intend to study for a second degree at the same level as one they already hold (e.g., a second honours degree) are also not eligible for postgraduate awards.

Main areas of support/sources of funds

UCT (GOB) - University of Cape town - General Operating Budget

Funds provided by UCT Council to the General Operating Budget

DEPT - Departmental Scholarships

Departmental funds are derived from funds raised by individual academics, academic departments and/or units

DON - Donated Funds

Donated funds are funds received from sponsors

INV - Invested Funds

Part of the annual income from specific investments that are held by the university are used for scholarship support

NRF - National Research Foundation

NRF is a government funded agency that provides funds to support research at universities

The PGFO is the guardian of all these funds. We are responsible for managing these funds and ensuring that the recipients of each scholarship are paid

Funding tenure & income limits

FIRST THREE YEARS of doctoral study

R283 000 funding limit

FIRST TWO YEARS of master's study

R230 000 funding limit

FIRST YEAR of honours study

R172 000 funding limit

Annual funding limitations

These funding limitations apply to the scholarships and bursaries managed by the PGFO.
Students can accept more than one scholarship as long as the total amount doesn't exceed these figures each year.

Please note that financial-need* applicants will only be awarded funding up to their cost of attendance which is calculated as follows:

- tuition
- once-off book allowance
- res/rental or live-at-home allowance
- food allowance
- travel allowance

Eligibility criteria

- TYPES OF DEGREES: Honours, master's & doctoral
- STUDENT STATUS: Most funding opportunities are only available for fulltime studies, but there are a few options available to students studying part-time
- NATIONALITY: Most of the scholarships are only available to South African citizens or permanent residents. However, there are a few scholarships for students located elsewhere in the world.

Ineligible categories

- These degrees do not qualify for funding from the PGFO because they do not have a research focus: diplomas, certificates, BArch & LLB.
- Any fourth year linked to an undergraduate degree
- In addition, a second degree at the same level as one they already hold e.g. a second honours degree

*UCT allocates a variety of postgraduate funding awards for South Africans and permanent residents. These awards are allocated based on merit, financial need or both.
