Award Details:

The Applied Global Health Research Board supports applied research that will be of direct and primary benefit to the health of vulnerable populations. They are looking for research projects that will develop practical solutions to health challenges. The research question might involve different disciplines and approaches from outside the health sector, but the primary objective must be health focused.

Note that the Applied Global Health Research Board is specifically interested in funding applied research, which they define as being research projects that will develop practical solutions to global health challenges and inequities. The aim is to fund a portfolio of high-quality global research which will be diverse, promote multi-disciplinarity and strengthen global health research capacity.

This includes:

- late-stage intervention development and testing, which can include global health trials
- implementation and scale-up research
- health systems, health policy and health economics research

They will not fund discovery research or research that includes an applied component that fits within a current board or panel remit. This includes early translation.

Eligibility:

You can apply for this opportunity if you are a researcher based at an eligible research organisation. These include:

- universities or higher education institutions based in low and middle- income countries (LMICs) with degree-awarding powers recognised by the government in which the organisation is based
- For more details on institutional and individual eligibility, please see the MRC guidance for applicants and UKRI eligibility requirements.

This is a two-stage application with only outline proposals being required at this stage.
